Free access for young people, schools, youth provision and support workers throughout the Humberside Police Force area.





Learners follow interactive pathways made up of a series of short films co-produced with young people and professionals in the Humberside Police Force area. Having chosen or been allocated an age-appropriate* pathway with relevant key issues, learners watch films in bitesize chunks, take part in quizzes about what they think is going on in the stories and are given video feedback from specialists.

When modules are completed, learners can take an end assessment for which they will gain a certificate of achievement when the pass mark is achieved.

Learners can progress at their own pace by logging in and out of their account with their progress saved as well as retaking assessments as required.

NIOC Interact is available for free to all young people in the Humberside Police Force area.





Why use NIOC Interact?

NIOC Interact supports three main user types:

- Individual young people who can access age-appropriate pathways (school year 6 to further education).
- School and youth provision users who can register and monitor the progress of several young learners.
- Support workers of individual young people and families wishing to create a learning pathway targeted for their needs.

Young People

Young people can watch and interact with short films based on real life events and made with young people from your local area. They cover serious subjects but are both engaging and informative to show what is really going on for some people living near you. You will learn more about the people and situations that people your age could face, the warning signs that someone you know could be at risk and what you could do to help.

Each module has a short quiz at the end. When you complete this with enough correct answers you will be awarded with a certificate of achievement.

- Short films based on real life events in your area.
- Interactive quizzes about films.
- Complete on your own or with friends.
- Certificate of achievement when completed.
- Different levels from year 6 through to year 11+.


Why use NIOC Interact?

Schools and Youth provision

Teachers and group leaders can access a range of lessons covering key learning points on important and sensitive issues such as grooming, sexual and criminal exploitation, that are classified by an age suitability rating at the group leader's discretion.

Young learners are typically engaged with realistic situations and characters that have been developed with people of a similar age to create a deeper level of empathy and understanding of the learning points of each film. Young people affected by issues raised will be directed towards a range of options for support and advice if they or someone they know might be at risk of grooming and exploitation.

- Set-up pathways suitable for years 6, 7 to 9 and 10 to 11.
- Suitable for a one-off or series of sessions in or out of school/groups.
- Tracks progress and notifies group leaders on progress achieved.
- Certificate of achievement for learners completing modules (digitally generated and printer compatible).
- Log in and out to monitor and support progress at the learner's own pace.
- Provides aspects of 'being safe and respectful relationships' learning objectives of Relationships and Sex Education (RSE).

Why use NIOC Interact?

Support Workers

Support workers can access all NIOC Interact modules and films to select the most relevant stories and issues to target the needs of the young person, people, or family they are working with.

Young people can access NIOC Interact independently or in sessions with support workers to support shared learning and open discussion. Learners are engaged with real-life based stories and interactive questions throughout with opportunities to test knowledge and opinion on the issues raised.

Young people can provide direct feedback to Not In Our Community so that their voice is heard and young people with lived experiences can, if they wish, work with the team to create new concepts, and help to develop new films from storylines through to production.

- Choose films and modules closest to the risks and experiences of individual learners.
- Suitable for a one-off or a programme of support.
- Certificate of achievement for learners completing modules.
- Opportunity for young people to feed their experiences and ideas into NIOC's creation process for upcoming films and activities.
